

Introduction

Beginner

- Basic Keyboard Familiarization

- Introduction to proper posture and finger technique
- Fundamental Music Theory

- Learning major scales (C major, G major)
- Simple chords: C, G, F, and basic chord progressions

Intermediate

- 8. Introduction to dynamics and expression in music
- 9. Rhythmic Variety and Complex Timing
- 10. Practicing pieces in different time signatures (6/8, 2/4)
- 11. Syncopation and polyrhythmic exercises
- 12. Working on playing with consistency and precision
- 13. Learning Pieces and Styles
- 14. Introduction to classical pieces and popular tunes
- 15. Basic improvisation on scales and chords
- 16. Introduction to genre styles: jazz, blues, and pop
