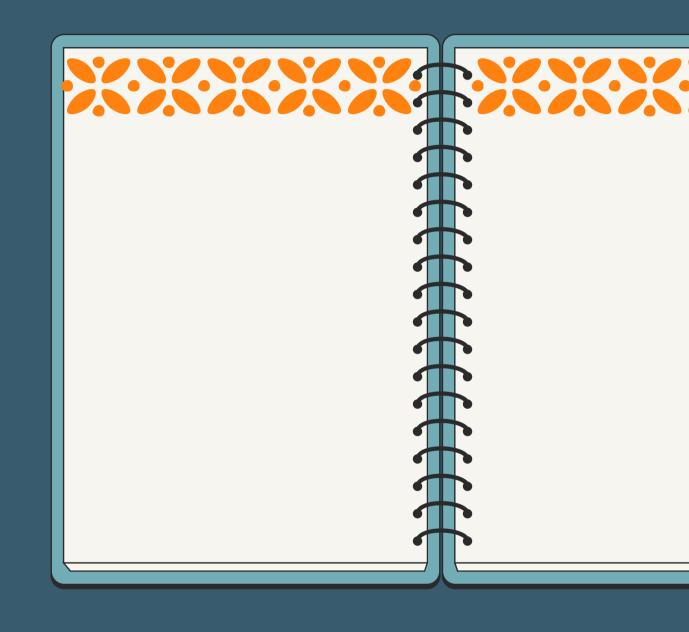















UKULELE

Curriculum - Beginner/Intermediate/Advanced




Introduction

With just a few chords and strumming patterns, the ukulele opens up a world of fun, allowing players to explore genres from pop to traditional folk.



Beginner

- Playing easy melodies using tabs

- 7. Alternating between strumming and fingerpicking in songs
- 8. Playing simple arpeggios for added texture

- 10. Learning popular songs in different genres (pop, folk, jazz)
- 11. Practicing dynamics and rhythm changes within songs
- 12. Developing stage presence and playing with confidence
- 13. Introduction to Barre Chords
- 14. Learning to play barre chords (e.g., Bm, F#m)
- 15. Transitioning smoothly between barre and open chords
- 16. Using barre chords to explore new keys and styles
